

MONTEVERDI VESPERS



Claudio Monteverdi, whose contemporaries were Allegri and Schütz, was born in Italy in 1567. He is conventionally viewed as the first Baroque composer although his musical roots were in the Renaissance with composers such as Palestrina, Victoria and Byrd. He is credited with creating the recitative style and was part of the rise of a form of musical drama called opera. He wrote both secular and religious works which included operas, ballets, madrigals, motets and masses as well as the Marian Vespers.

The structure and texts of the Vespers service were laid down some time between 530-43, over a thousand years before Monteverdi's time, in The Rule of St. Benedict. The Vespers are built around several Biblical texts that are traditionally used as part of the liturgy for several Marian feasts in the Roman Catholic church. Vesper time varied according to the season between the tenth hour (4 pm) and the twelfth (6 pm).



Monteverdi used the set texts but set them to music using the new compositional styles which he had helped to develop for his secular music. In the Vespers he blends old and new styles and this approach earned the work a place in history. The old was polyphonic composition with flowing strict counterpoint, prepared dissonance, and equality of voices whilst the new had a much freer counterpoint with an increasing hierarchy of voices, emphasising soprano and bass.

Each movement is based on a traditional Gregorian plainchant. Monteverdi developed these simple melodies and wove into them a rich variety of new and old musical forms: chants, plainsong, arias, divided choirs, sonata, hymn and motet.
